

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

1. What is the academic eligibility to apply for Integrated 5 year LL.B Entrance Examination conducted by CEE Kerala ?

- (a) Candidate should have passed the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Kerala or any other examination recognised by the Universities in Kerala as equivalent thereto.
- (b) A candidate who has passed an examination in 10+2 Course of schooling recognised by the educational authority of the Central or State Government or possesses such academic qualifications which are considered equivalent to such 10+2 course by the Bar Council of India can also apply for admission to the course. Applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary pass certificate or first degree certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission. The applicants who have obtained 10 +2 or graduation/post graduation through open universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission.
- (c) Candidates who are appearing/ appeared for the qualifying examination are also eligible to apply for the Entrance Examination. Such candidates become eligible for admission only if they produce the Pass Certificate and Mark List of the qualifying examination at the time of admission.
- (d) No candidate shall be admitted to the Course, unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination with a minimum of 45% marks. However, candidates belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes need only 42% marks and those belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes need only 40% marks in the qualifying examination. No rounding off of percentage of marks to the nearest higher integer is permitted.

2. Is there any age limit for admission to Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course 2020 ?

There is no upper age limit for admission to Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course 2020 as of now. But this will be subject to the final order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

3. In my knowledge there is no upper age limit for admission to Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course. Am I right?

4. I am 40 years of age, and keen to study law? Can I apply for Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course?

Yes, There is no upper age limit for admission to Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course 2020 as of now. But this will be subject to the final order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

5. I am a candidate belonging to SEBC community. What documents should I enclose with the application for claiming community reservation?

6. You are required to enclose a Non Creamy Layer Certificate obtained from the village officer in the prescribed format, which you can download from the website of the CEE. The above certificate should be uploaded with the online application and should be produced before the college authorities in original at the time of admission.

6. What document should a candidate belonging to SC/ST community submit for claiming community reservation? Is there any upper income limit for being eligible for communal reservation?

A candidate belonging to SC/ST community should upload community certificate obtained from the Tahsildar in the prescribed format downloadable from the website of the CEE and the original should be produced at the time of admission. There is no limit on annual income for SC/ST category for claiming communal reservation. Hence, they need not submit income certificate.

7. I am a child of an inter-caste married couple. My father belongs to forward community and my mother belongs to SEBC category. Am I eligible for claiming SEBC reservation? If so, what should I do to claim the benefit?

Yes, you are eligible for claiming reservation under SEBC category provided you belong to that category. For this, you have to upload Non Creamy Layer certificate from the Village Officer, in the prescribed format that you can download from the website of the CEE and the original should be produced at the time of admission. *Further, you have to express your choice of community in the online application.*

8. I am a child of an inter-caste married couple. My father belongs to forward community and my mother belongs to SC/ST category. Am I eligible for claiming SC/ST reservation? If so, what should I do to claim the benefit?

Yes, you are eligible for claiming reservation under SC/ST category provided you belong to that category. For this, you have to upload inter-

caste marriage certificate from the Tahsildar. In addition, you also have to upload Community Certificate from the Tahsildar showing that you are SC/ST. Both the certificates should be obtained in the prescribed format that you can download from the website of the CEE. The certificates in original should be produced at the time of admission.

9. I intend to apply for Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course in sports quota. What should I do?

You have to submit online application as per the instructions contained in the prospectus for the year 2020. Further, you have to forward a photocopy of the application with relevant documents to the Secretary, Kerala State Sports Council, Thiruvananthapuram - 695001, before the last date of submission of application.[see clause 11(iii)]

10. Is there special reservation for NCC for Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course?

Yes. [ see clause 8 B(c) and 11(vi)]

You have to submit online application as per the instructions contained in the prospectus for the year 2020. Further, you have to forward a printout of the application with relevant documents to the Additional Director General, NCC (Kerala), PB No.2212, Vazhuhacaud, Thiruvananthapuram - 695010, before the last date of submission of application.

11. I am an SC converted to Christianity. Am I eligible for SC seat reservation?

No. However, you are eligible for reservation under Backward Christian and OEC categories, for which you have to upload Non-Creamy Layer Certificate along with the application and the original should be produced at the time of admission.

12. I am a candidate belonging to Dheevera community(*Example*), If I gain admission in general merit, am I eligible for fee concession?

Yes. You are eligible for fee concession as applicable to OEC candidates, provided you have uploaded Non-Creamy Layer Certificate along with the application and the original should be produced at the time of admission.

13. I am a candidate belonging to SC community, but my annual family income exceeds Rs. 6.00 lakhs. Am I eligible for SC reservation?

Yes. There is no income limit for SC/ST reservation.

14. Should I be a native of Kerala to be eligible to apply for Integrated 5 Year LL.B Course?

No. Any Indian citizen fulfilling the eligibility conditions laid down in Clause 6 of the prospectus for the year 2020 can apply. But only keralites coming under section(a) of clause 6(i) are eligible for any type of reservation/fee concession.

15. What are the points to be taken care of regarding online uploading of photo?

The candidate has to upload his/her latest passport size colour photograph (studio taken) with light background, in jpg format. The size should not be more than 30 kb and dimensions 150 pixels (width) X 200 pixels (height).

The photograph should be clear and should not be taken with the candidate wearing cap or goggles. Spectacles are allowed, if being used regularly. Polaroid and computer/mobile phone generated photos are not acceptable. Non-compliance of these instructions may lead to rejection of application.

16. I had qualified in the Integrated 5 Year LL.B entrance examination held in 2019, but did not get admission. Will I be considered for 2020 allotment?

No. You have to write the entrance examination for the year 2020 and qualify in it for being considered for the allotment for the year 2020.
